Pathways are regularly reviewed and updated by a team of GP clinical editors, with input from local specialists and other subject matter experts, so the guidance remains trusted and up to date.

The PHASES project aims to streamline and enhance primary care for cardiovascular disease (CVD). Quick access to locally relevant clinical guidance and referral information at the point of care is critical for timely intervention and improved health outcomes.

How does it work?

HealthPathways integrates into general practice workflows in the following ways:

Point-of-care decision support:

when a patient presents with CVD risk factors or symptoms, clinicians can open HealthPathways from their device to view locally relevant information.

Streamlined referral process: if a patient requires referral to specialist or allied health services, it's easy to find the most appropriate pathway and service directory for their region.

Statewide access: HealthPathways portals are available for all Queensland regions.
